

On behalf of AVLD, we look forward to your engagement in helping us to Be The Change.




OUR VISION

To create, ignite and nurture a network of exceptional leaders from Australia and Vietnam to accelerate efforts towards the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.




OUR PURPOSE
